An Update from the Financial Sustainability Task Force

Over the past several months, Task Force members have focused on the key task of identifying a sustainable, values-based financial model for membership that will provide the stable income stream required to support the temple and our vibrant community into the future. To date we have been working in two ways: conducting research about different financial models, and having an ongoing communal conversation about our community values connected to money and financing congregational needs.

Building on the input that we received from members thus far, and additional research, a summary of identified values was shared at the June 7th annual meeting. Following that we introduced our current thinking about a new financial model. Those of you who were present saw a video of our co-vice-president Miranda Phillips speaking about a model that her current “sabbatical” congregation in Massachusetts adopted, parts of which align with our current approach but in a more clearly articulated, holistic way. With thanks to Miranda, we’ve considered this model (among others), and have amended it to optimize alignment with our community values.

In late summer and early fall, we will again reach out to members of our community through a series of discussions to ensure that every member has the opportunity to provide input on the new model. Our timeline is to plan for a November congregational meeting at which time we will decide on whether to adopt the new model as our financial foundation.

We look forward to your input and to continuing our work on creating a system that will ensure the financial health, vitality, and future of our congregation within the Jewish framework of giving from the heart for all to benefit.

THE MODEL THUS FAR:

Components of the model have their roots in the book of Exodus about the Israelites first communal project, the building of the Mishkan. Contributions were raised through two key elements: a “half shekel” tax on every community member, and through contributions based according to every member’s talents and financial means.

The approach we are most interested in involves three components:

1. A nominal “half shekel” assessment. Similar to the concept of “half shekel” as it has been applied to participating in our Each for All program, the “half shekel” component stems from the tradition that every member must contribute equally to the foundation of the

community, ensuring that as a starting point, everyone is on an equal footing, contributing the same amount.

2. Sliding scale dues, based on self-assessment. This key component is the cornerstone of our current approach to dues and reflects the understanding that those who earn more are in a position to contribute more for the greater good, but all must contribute in some way.

3. Like most congregations, our current revenue sources net only about 70% of our expenses. Therefore, a third component is essential: a “*nediv lev*” contributory campaign is recommended to be launched every spring in lieu of the separate “Rabbi fund” campaigns to ensure that we meet the commitments that have been made to our building and our permanent staff. Literally meaning “from the heart,” this “*nediv lev*” contribution is in keeping with

Jewish tradition that stresses individual obligation to the community and shared responsibility. Each member unit will be expected to make an additional contribution “from the heart” of an amount that is right for them, and in keeping with the shared responsibility for all.

Tompkins County Highway Department began its Adopt-A-Highway Program in 1992. The Program was initiated to provide for litter pick-up along County roadsides and for the opportunity for roadside beautification by volunteer organizations.

In 2010, Tikkun v’Or adopted a 1.2 mile stretch of North Triphammer Road between Cherry Road and Hillcrest Road. Each year, several congregants spend a couple of morning hours providing service to our community on behalf of TvO. Our roadsides are less littered, and removal of objects along the roadside provides both a safer and cleaner environment for motorists, bikers, and pedestrians alike.

B'Yachad Ithaca Jewish Preschool was founded in 2012, and is now completing its third school year. B'Yachad, the only Jewish preschool in the Ithaca area, offers a warm, nurturing environment for children ages 2-5. We offer a full day program, including after-school care. In addition to our July preschool summer camp, Gan B'Yachad, we also offer Machane B'Yachad, a Jewish summer day camp for children ages 5-8. This is the only Jewish summer program in Ithaca!

The educational approach of our preschool is to foster learning by play and exploration, while building children's self esteem. Our fabulous teachers provide a joyful, caring environment, where every child is valued for their unique contributions and character.

Unlike any other preschool in the Ithaca area, we offer a strong Jewish element in our program. Children learn about Jewish holidays and values through stories, games, art and music. Children embark on a journey in Hebrew literacy through Hebrew singing and practical vocabulary throughout the day. As a community school, the Jewish background of our children is diverse, and we meet every child on their level without judgment or expectation. Our goal is to instill within each child a love and excitement for his or her Jewish identity, while nurturing early childhood development, growth and learning.

We are so thankful to Temple Beth El, who generously provides a lovely preschool room for B'Yachad, a large, beautiful play yard for our children, as well as vital administrative support.

B'Yachad is thriving today thanks to generous support from the Ithaca Area United Jewish Community (IAUJC). While the program was first being established, the IAUJC provided essential funds to support our young school, by helping pay teacher salaries and cover start-up costs for our program. Thanks to a grant from the IAUJC this spring, B'Yachad will be able to provide partial scholarships for eligible families in the 2015-16 school year. Due to the generosity of the IAUJC, a Jewish preschool education will be accessible to more of Ithaca's Jewish families.
