Co-Presidents' Words

Greetings TvO members and friends. We appreciate the opportunity to partner with you these next two years, in helping our community continue to thrive. We thought it important for you to know a bit more about us, as we look forward to learning more about each of you.



My name is Shawn Murphy and I will be serving our vibrant congregation as one of our co-presidents for the next two years. I live in the Town of Lansing, out towards King Ferry with my wife of 11 years, Leanne (a lifelong Lansing resident), our two homeschooled boys Avram (10) and Logan (7) along with several non-human companions. I was born and raised in a semi-Conservative Jewish household in the City of Buffalo and spent my college years at Ranger School in Wanakena, N.Y. (in the Adirondacks) and SUNY ESF in Syracuse. After a hiatus from congregational life, I found Tikkun v'Or a few years ago while attending a Shabbat service led by Annie Wexler and Tony Gaenslen. The warm and welcoming atmosphere, along with the genuine acceptance of my interfaith family and the amazing Jewish community helped me make the easy decision to become

a member. In my professional life, I have spent the past eight plus years as a natural resource conservationist with the Cortland County Soil and Water Conservation District (feel free to ask me about it sometime). I enjoy spending free time with my family, in the great outdoors, fishing, taking in some fresh forest air or working in my vegetable garden.

I'm Miranda Phillips, and I'm looking forward to serving with you all, too. I was raised Reform, in San Diego, and have had meaningful connections with Reform and Reconstructionist synagogues since. Most formatively, my parents made it clear why Judaism was important to them, but didn't push it – just hoped I would find my own value in it; and so I did. I found Tikkun v'Or twenty years ago: I was involved here meaningfully as a Cornell college student – teaching first grade, leading High Holiday services, and organizing an adult b'nei mitzvah class. My husband Bobby and I then left for Boston-area grad schools,



returning in 2006, when he became a Cornell professor.

Since then, I've loved my latest TvO involvements: leading High Holiday services again; coordinating the "Each for All" program; joining the board with Shawn; and helping to usher in the new financial structure and "Nediv Lev." I'm now a 7-year resident of Ithaca's Fall Creek neighborhood, with Bobby and our two kids, Julia (6) and Will (3). Together, we love reading, puns, picnics, music (especially rounds, and songs that get us up and dancing, in our kitchen and at shul), and family movie night ("E.T." has been a recent favorite). In my professional life, I was for many years a Jewish educator; took a break when I had kids, and now focus on climate advocacy (for national carbon pricing).

We look forward to these next two years: helping you deepen relationships with each other and with us; reflecting together on our shared goals; and continuing to strengthen the programs and services by which we learn and find meaning and support each other at critical times – of loss, difficulty, and joy. We look forward to hearing from you, about the ways you'd like to connect, contribute, and find support in our wonderful Jewish community.

Gan and Kitah Alef א כיתה (K/grade 1) collected and counted all the tzedakah from their class and in TVO tzedakah boxes, and chose to donate \$72 to the Friendship Center.

Kitah Vav ו כיתה (grade 6) and **Kitah Zayin** ז כיתה (grade 7): **Please note that the midweek class will continue to be held on Wednesdays!** Please plan other activities accordingly. Classes will be taught by Cantor Abbe Lyons and as assistant on Wednesdays from 4:15 - 5:45 p.m. Rabbi Brian Walt will also work with the class for several sessions.

Students in all grades should be practicing Hebrew this summer. Summer Hebrew reading practice is essential at all levels so that this year's learning is not forgotten. Aim to practice for 10 minutes once or twice each week.

Rising to Kitah Gimel (3rd grade): Continue in your Hebrew books. If you are using a Hebrew primer or Ramah 2, try to complete that book. Some of you have started Ramah 4. Finish your Ramah and you will be super stars. Practice all the letters and vowels and putting them together. You'll be ready to read Hebrew more fluently in the fall!

Rising to Kitah Daled and Hey (4th and 5th grade): Many in the class are working through Ramah 4, 5, or 6. Some need to finish Ramah 2 or 3. All students should be very familiar with all the letters and vowels now, and are working on fluency. Finish these booklets and don't forget all the hard work you've done in reading Hebrew this year, and you will be reading tefillot (prayers) in the fall!

Rising to Kitah Vav and Zayin (6th and 7th grade): Whether you are working on Ramah 7 or 9, or something slightly earlier or later, all students know many prayers and can generally read Hebrew, but you still need to make sure you

can read letter and vowel combinations smoothly.

Annual Meeting Update

On Sunday, June 5, approximately 35 temple members came together during our 2016 annual meeting to share a light lunch (thanks Anne and Ira Brous for providing it), vote on the budget and new board slate, and a change to the bylaws elevating the bereavement group to committee status, and to celebrate our joyous community.

The votes all passed unanimously. Temple members spent time reflecting on past congregational events or moments that had been especially meaningful. The list of meaningful engagements was long and varied. Many reported enjoying holiday celebrations together, temple programs including music, movies, and discussions, and Friday night lay-led services. People were grateful for our shared acknowledgement of life events and many noted the work of the bereavement group as a special gift to our community. Several expressed how happy they are having stable rabbinic leadership and for our growing role in the community.

Suggestions for how to strengthen connections to the temple and to each other in the future included further establishing our caring committee, learning more about events that occur through the temple (e.g. how many people participated in a program), re-starting movie night and other social events (and adding a movie night for kids), setting up networking for families with babies and young children, and offering more adult education opportunities including a class about Shabbat services and how to appreciate the service.

Energy Task Force

If you haven't been in the mechanical rooms in the attic lately, you likely haven't noticed all the building improvements. The Energy Task Force is happy to announce that Phase 1 of our efforts to reduce the carbon footprint of the synagogue is nearly complete! After months of planning, and with the generous support of an anonymous donor, we have had:

- insulation and air-sealing put in over the lights,
- cellulose insulation blown into the attic,
- foam insulation installed in the mechanical rooms,
- spray foam applied to the ductwork, and
- the cupola sealed with insulated glass.

All this work should reduce our energy demands for heating by about 30% and cooling by about 20%!!

The rest of phase 1 (putting weather stripping put on all doors and installing new lights outdoors), should be completed within a few weeks. Our goals were to reduce our energy consumption and carbon footprint, as well as to reduce light pollution by following the DarkSky guidelines (<http://darksky.org/>). The new lights will have LED bulbs with motions sensors to turn on when cars pull into the drive, and when people approach the building. A light containing a light sensor will come on outside the front door to the building at night to keep that area lit.

We estimate that the above improvements will reduce the building's carbon footprint by 50%, compared to 2015 energy use!! And we aren't done yet! Stayed tuned for Phases 2 (heat pumps) and 3 (solar energy).

The IAUJC is delighted to announce our first ever Financial Awards to families in the Ithaca area who will send their children to Jewish camps this summer. Four children, ages 10 to 16, will be off to camp shortly. They will learn new skills, make friends and have an opportunity to become deeply identified with the Jewish people. A total of \$5,470 was made available to four families in the amounts of \$500, \$1000, \$1000 and \$2970 using a 'need-based' process. Only the relevant camp administrators know each family's financial information and they determine the level of need.

The awards program was formed in response to the community's leadership indicating that this should be our Jewish Community's high priority. The goal is that every child in the Ithaca area who would like to attend a Jewish Summer Camp or Teen Experience is able to do so. The **Camp/Teen Experience Initiative** focuses on several aspects, including raising awareness of the programs available, encouraging youth to attend and their families to consider sending their children, *and* providing financial awards when needed to help make that possible. This year's grant cycle ended May 31.

Without financial support, this initiative would not be possible. We are indebted to the funds made available through the Robert and Marcia Ascher Endowment of the IAUJC and to Linda and Stephen Pope.
