Adult Education with Rabbi Shifrah

COUNTING THE OMER — It's Ancient, Contemporary, Earthy, and Mystical! Sunday, May 15, 3:30-5:30 pm, in person at TvO

Join Rabbi Shifrah for poetry, playfulness, and contemplative practice to enhance your springtime journey from the liberation of Passover to the receiving of wisdom associated with Shavuot. Counting the Omer is a tradition from Judaism loaded with rich symbolism, and attached to a simple 49-day practice. Rabbi Shifrah will share brief poetic meditations and light-hearted stories, and offer tools for engaging in the practice in a meaningful way. Whether you are new to counting the Omer, or a long time practitioner, this will be a fun and engaging opportunity to learn more.

About Counting the Omer: The Omer represents a period in ancient days when the people would travel to the temple in Jerusalem to make offerings from their early spring harvest. Seven weeks later, they would bring an offering from their second harvest. Later, after the destruction of the temples, the counting of seven weeks became associated with the journey from the liberation of Passover to the receiving of Torah represented by Shavuot.

Each day of the Omer is referred to in kabbalistic literature (Jewish mysticism) as a gateway to Divine Presence. These gates serve as spiritual guideposts, an opportunity to re-orient oneself on the trail of life. This offers us fertile spiritual soil in which to notice qualities we may want to nurture, such as kindness, discipline, balance, endurance, awe, and connection. Its agricultural and communal origins also make the Omer an excellent opportunity for considering our relationship to each other, the Earth that sustains us, and the Source and Breath of All Life.

Jewish Learning Experiences

We didn't have many classes in April, but it was still chock-full of Jewish Learning Experiences!

Kitah bet/gimel ב"ג ביתה (second and third grade) students actively practiced the Four Questions for Passover. How active? With bean bag throwing, jumping, playing Passover Twister, and enthusiastic singing. They also led a special Sunday morning tefillah session for their families. Students demonstrated what they've learned about prayers of thanks, prayer of wishes, and songs for peace and joy.

Kitah daled-heh ד"ה ביתה (fourth and fifth grade) students considered how and why we acknowledge both the bitter and the sweet on Passover and other times, with maror and charoset, and with stories of both challenges and the celebration of freedom. They'll be leading a **Shabbat service on Friday, May 20**. Daled/Hey families can **bring your own picnic dinner at 6:15 pm**, and join for services with Miranda and the students at **7 pm**. The service will also be on Zoom for everyone to join.

Kitah vav/zayin ו"ז ביתה (sixth and seventh grade) continued Torah study. Several of the spring parashot (portions) discuss leprosy, so they also learned about nurse Lillian D. Wald (1867-1940), who revolutionized the delivery of healthcare to poor New Yorkers and led a grassroots, science-based response to the flu pandemic of 1918-19. They also tasted offerings from Michael Twitty's African American Seder Plate <https://afroculinaria.com/2019/04/16/african-american-seder-plate/> and discussed how this chef/author/historian uses food, ritual, and African-American-Jewish foodways as a medium for self-discovery and liberation. They studied Torah stories about scapegoats, and blame, and goats in general. They read poetry and stories by [Lesléa Newman](#), author of *Heather Has Two Mommies* and the poem *Pandemic Pantoum*, among many other writings.

On Saturday, May 14, Kitah Zayin students will meet at Lime Hollow Nature Center for a **B'Mitzvah Nature Experience** with Michael Margolin.

Last month, JLE students also learned with Rabbi Shifrah, creating their own movements to the seder song and a dramatic crossing of the Red Sea: <https://tikkunvor.org/sedersong2022/>

Family JLE students learned about the mitzvah of Bikkur Cholim, caring for the sick. They made cards for staff at Cayuga Medical Center and dry soup mix jars to give to sick friends. They had a Passover adventure, choosing ingredients for charoset (marshmallows were a favorite!), smashing grapes to make grape juice, and hiding and finding afikomen.



WHAT'S NEW FROM ITHACA AREA UNITED JEWISH COMMUNITY!

- Our **Annual Holocaust Commemoration** took place virtually on April 27th. Celia Clement, a second-generation Holocaust survivor from Ithaca, spoke about her family memoir, *Three Sisters: A True Holocaust Story of Love, Luck, and Survival*. There was a candle lighting ceremony to honor the lives lost, a performance by the Cornell Chai Notes, and a presentation by the youth of Temple Beth El. Our thanks to Temple Beth El for hosting the Zoom presentation.
- Our **Global Spotlight Initiative** received 5 proposals from interested local community members (thank you for your interest!) for support of international organizations that promote the pillars of IAUGC. We had \$2000 to donate from our Global Fund. Two organizations were selected:
 - **Dental Volunteers of Israel (DVI)**, nominated by Scott Noren, will receive \$1500. Their website is <https://dental-dvi.org.il/>.
 - **Givat Haviva International School**, nominated by Noemi Kraut, will receive \$500. Their website is <https://gh-is.org/>
- Our **Campership** program, supported by the Robert and Marcia Ascher Endowment to IAUGC will be helping to finance camp attendance for 2022. Five campers from five different families will attend five different camps. Our support totals \$8200 this summer.
- We now support 166 subscriptions to the PJ Library Jewish storybook program in our local area! That is a lot of Jewish culture and ethics being transmitted to our next generation.


